Dear Property Owner/Resident:

I'm writing today to provide an update on the ongoing remediation of the Pleasantville former Manufactured Gas Plant (MGP) site. The site is located at the south and northwestern corners of Old Turnpike Road and North Franklin Boulevard in Pleasantville, New Jersey.

The initial phase of work has been completed. This phase focused on the demolition of existing structures on site (garage and shed), removal of subsurface infrastructure related to the former plant's operations, and removal and replacement with clean fill of approximately 9,800 tons of impacted soils.

All activities were performed in accordance with the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection's Technical Requirements for Site Remediation and under the oversight of the New Jersey Licensed Remediation Professional.

This summer, SJG plans to remove two buildings owned by the company (18 and 22 North Franklin Boulevard) near the corner of Old Turnpike Road and North Franklin Boulevard. Both buildings will be removed down to their concrete slabs, allowing SJG contractors to access areas for sampling in order to complete final delineation of impacts from former MGP operations.

The second phase of remediation activities is anticipated to begin in early 2018 and will address the remaining impacts from the Pleasantville former MGP site.
